**Genesis and Geology**

“In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth” (Genesis 1:1). How did everything come into being? Some people claim that there is a conflict between the Bible and science. The Bible says God created everything in six days. Geologists claim that the earth is four billion years old, and astrophysicists claim that the universe is about seventeen billion years old. Can these scientific tenets be harmonized with the Bible account?

One of the deterrents to believing the Bible’s claim that God created the universe in six days is the “geologic column” which presents a series of geological events that, according to geologists, took millions of years to transpire. We want to believe the Bible, yet we do not want to ignore the facts of science. Let us ask, “In view of the geological record, can the Bible account of a six-day creation period be accepted?” Or maybe we should reverse that to read, “In view of the Bible account of a six-day creation period, can the geological record be accepted?”

Actually, we can accept both. The two accounts can easily be harmonized. We are not attempting to make each “day” a long period of millions of years. The Bible “days” are literal 24-hour days. The accounts may be reconciled via the “apparent age” doctrine. With thanks to research done by *Apologetics Press*, we present the following solution.

How old was Adam one hour after God created him? He was one hour old. How old was Eve one hour after she was created? She was one hour old. How old did they *appear* to be? Probably in their twenties or thirties. The plants in the Garden of Eden were full grown. The animals also were created full grown. Adam was created as a full-grown, mature, adult male. Eve was created as a full grown, mature, adult female. What about the earth and the universe? They also were created as mature and full grown. God did not create a baby earth, nor did he create a baby universe. Although the earth is younger than some suppose, it went through every phase that was necessary to bring it to its present state. It did so at an accelerated pace, within the six-day period of creation. God did not try to “trick” or “fool” anyone. He did everything needed to present us with an “adult” earth.

None of us were present at the creation, so we do not know how God did his work, but the “apparent age” doctrine is in harmony with both the Bible and science. “For in six days the Lord made heaven and earth, the sea, and all that is in them, and rested on the seventh day. Therefore the Lord blessed the Sabbath day and made it holy” (Exodus 20:11). If God could at all create a universe, he could do it in six days.
