New thinking on how to share the gospel of Christ and build His church?

How does a Relationship Based Discipline approach differ from the usual church “program”? Instead of inviting people to a program or class for which they sign up, attend and complete their assignments, they are invited into a relationship of mutual love, transparency and accountability.

Of course, discipling relationships contain programmatic elements such as curriculum, but the relational dynamics are primary. How does a relationship differ from a program? Let’s contrast “relationship” with “program”.

Primarily, discipling relationships are marked by intimacy, whereas programs tend to be focused on information. Alicia Britt Cole captures this difference between program and relationship. “Program was safer, more controllable, and reproducible--less risky, less mess, less intrusive. It seemed easier to give to someone an outline than an hour, a well-worn book than a window into our humanity. How easy it is to substitute informing people for investing in people, to confuse organizing with actually discipling people. Life is not the offspring of program or paper. Life is the offspring of life. Jesus prioritized shoulder to shoulder mentoring because his prize was much larger than information; it was integration.
