Paul, the author of Philippians, uses another word, however. His word comes across in English as "excellence." And when instructing early Christians about what to think about and how to think, he says that Christians should consider "if there is any excellence" in it. Paul's word referred mainly to moral excellence, those morally beautiful things that highlight the very best in our humanity. This was his standard for the thought life and decision-making of Christians. Not just what's good. But what is excellent, what's most likely to make us pause and give honor or thanks or recognition to whatever it is we're beholding. Moral excellence is the standard for Christians. Not what's morally "good enough." So, in the life of Christians, good becomes the enemy of excellence. We'll end our series on discernment with these thoughts today.
